

IFALPA Press Release on the missing Flight MH 370

The International Federation of Air Line Pilots' Associations (IFALPA) is closely monitoring reports of the missing Malaysia Airlines Flight MH 370, a B777-200 aircraft enroute from Kuala-Lumpur (KUL) to Beijing (PEK).

Our thoughts and best hopes are with the 239 crew and passengers onboard the aircraft, and their families.

Whilst the search and rescue efforts are taking place, IFALPA stresses the need to avoid speculation as to what happened to the aircraft.

The Federation has reached out to the Malaysian Air Line Pilots' Association (MAPA) and will keep its resources at the disposal of the relevant investigative agencies in order to help gather facts and any other information which may be pertinent to this event.
